Good afternoon!	Wa uhara nawa? (s) Mwa uhara nawa? (pl)
Good Evening!	Wa tokerwa nawa? (s) Mwa tokerwa nawa? (pl)
Good night!	Tokerwa nawa. (early evening) Tokerwee nawa. (early evening)
Rara nawa. (late evening)	Raree nawa. (late evening)
Hello!	Tjike? or Koree?
I am fine.	Mbi ri nawa.
And you?	Korove?
See you later.	Matu hakaene kombunda.
Good-bye.	Kara nawa. or Karee nawa.
Thank you.	Okuhepa or Ndangi
You are welcome.	Okuhepa or Ndangi
Hi, we haven't seen each other for a long time.	Tjike, atata twa haṅika orure.
Are you doing well?	U ri nawa?
Yes, I am doing well.	Ii, mbi ri nawa.

Just a little.	Kaṭiṭi uriri.
What is your nationality?	Oove owehi riṅe?
I am a Namibian.	Ami owami Omunamibia.
